CASSAVA PROCESSING AND CORN MILLING CENTER PROJECT

Ndasemam community in Mfanteman District in the Central Region of Ghana is a farming community of about a thousand inhabitants. Though the people grow a lot of cassava and corn, many of the inhabitants live below the poverty line with many households living on less than a dollar a day. This is partially because most of the farm produce go bad as the farmers are unable to sell a lot of the produce during the major farming season. It is on this note that CRAN after being approached by the leaders of Ndasemam about their challenge applied to the German Embassy for support to construct a Gari and Corn Milling Center for the community.

Currently, the German Embassy has agreed to support the project, on the 30th of March 2016, CRAN signed the contract for the commencement of the project. The entire community of Ndasemam are in joyful anticipation of the processing Center which would be completed in a period of six (6) months. The Cassava Proessing and Corn Milling Center would be used to process cassava to produce gari and mill corn into dough. This would preserve and add value to the cassava and corn farm produce and enable farmers to sell them at a better price.
