Musunkwa School Library in Good Condition

The Musunkwa library which was constructed in 2012 by CRAN for the Musunkwa school and surrounding communities is still in a very good condition, and the children are using the facility. There are however very few books for the children to use and the Head teacher says that most the books are at a higher level than the level of the children. They will therefore need more books which are at the level of primary and JHS students. They are therefore appealing to the general public that whatever amount of money that can be donated to them to buy the books will be much appreciated. With the computers in the school, ten are working. They said they will be glad to have donation of additional computers up to about ten or even more because the children are many. There are other things they need such as classroom block for their JHS students, teachers' bungalows and jerseys for their sports kids as well as footballs and other sport kits.






The pictures show the main building to house the machines, the shed for the frying of the gari and the milling machine being installed in the main building. The project is about 95% complete.
