Recounting lessons learnt at the Camp, some said, they learnt waking up early to pray, read their Bibles and go for morning jogging, praying before embarking on any activity they would like to engage in, to be good, respect people, forgive, live to glorify God, etc. Michael and Patricia were privileged to visit the camp in the Volta Region and interacted with some campers especially the CESS beneficiaries.

BANK OF GHANA (BOG)'S WORKING VISIT TO CRAN MF

The Central Bank of Ghana (BoG) paid a three (3) day working visit to CRAN Microfinance between 10th to 12th September 2018. The visit forms part of their routine on-site examination to all financial institutions within their jurisdiction.

The officials focused on four main aspects being — Financials, Management, Systems and Controls. At the debriefing session, the officials commended CRAN MF for being so well organised. The Team Leader said she has not seen any Microfinance Organisation so well organised as CRAN Microfinance. She said specifically that being the first on-site examination 'CRAN MF could readily provide them with every document they requested" and they commended CRAN MF.

CRAN MF in turn acknowledged that these feats could not have been achieved without a strong governance structure. Management therefore gave the credit to the Board, both past and present for bringing CRAN MF to their current level. BoG made some recommendations for CRAN MF and would make the examination report available in two months.

CRAN wishes to use this medium to acknowledge the Board of Directors who have been the backbone of CRAN for these twenty – five years.
