Highlighted among the discussion was the Rice Sector Support Project (RSSP) project in the Volta Region due to be completed by the end of the year which has caused the development of over 500 hectors of low-lands for rice cultivation. The Cassava and Corn processing Center project in Central Region geared towards providing economic empowerment for the inhabitants of Ndaseman village is also due to be completed before the end of the year. Staff also deliberated on possible new projects to replace outgoing ones.

# SUCCESS STORIES FOR THE SEASON

The Competitive African Rice Initiative (CARI) project supervised in Ghana by Techno-Serve and sponsored by GIZ is making tremendous impact in its target communities. CRAN is implementing CARI in the Volta Region of Ghana with targets of training and assisting four thousand farmers in efficient production and marketing.

Currently, more than three thousand eight hundred people have benefitted from the project. The project which started in the last quarter of 2015 will end in the first quarter of 2017. Initially people in the target areas did not under-

stand the project hence it was a challenge bringing them on board, however with time, more farmers are trooping to the CRAN office for an opportunity to participate in the programme.

A total of about 693 hectares of land has been developed for rice cultivation. Mrs. Enyo Dakatse a beneficiary of CARI who used to produce only half an acre of rice has now been able to plant more than two acres of rice this year and had a good yield. Mrs Alice Awoho another beneficiary has been able to increase her yield this year from 1.5MTs to 3.21MT. It has also been a great delight of CRAN to see many young people getting interested in rice cultivation and farming in general in the cause of the project.
