CONSTRUCTION OF WATER STORAGE TANK FOR SANKOR COMMUNITY

Memory Verse:

1 JOHN 5:4 - "For whatever is born of God overcomes the world. And this is the victory that has overcome the world- our faith."

GHANA HEALTH SERVICE - COVID-19 VACCINE

COVID-19 vaccination in Ghana began on Monday 1st March 2021 after the country became the first recipient of the Oxford-AstraZeneca vaccine apart of the COVAX initiative. The COVID-19 vaccine was to be distributed in phases in Ghana.

As of Friday, April 30, a total of 849,527 AstraZeneca vaccines had been administered to the public.

On Wednesday, May 19 the second doses of Covishield, the Oxford AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccine had been administered to the segmented groups who received their first doses in March following the receipt of some additional 350,000 doses of the AstraZeneca vaccines, at the Kotoka International Airport, from the Democratic Republic of Congo under the Covax facility, in the early hours of Friday, May 7.

The public is still advised to adhere to the preventive measures such as wearing of nose masks and social distancing to help curb the spread of the virus.

Below are some of the measures the government of Ghana are still taken to prevent the spread of the Covid-19:

PREVENTIVE MEASURES FOR THE GENERAL PUBLIC

- Observe social distancing; Avoid handshaking
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, dispose the tissue in a closed bin, and then wash your hands.
- Always wear a mask, particularly when leaving home
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects or surfaces such as remote controls and doorknobs.




Figure 3: Distribution of COVID-19 cases in Ghana by week sample taken, Mar 2020- May 2021
