Scripture Union (SU) CAMP 2022 - Central

The Scripture Union organises an annual Life Build Camp for Primary and Junior High School (JHS) students across the country's regions. These yearly camps seek to provide grounds to nurture the young to grow in the knowledge of Jesus Christ. Last year in Central Region, it was held from December 19th to 22nd at the Ghana National College, Cape Coast. The theme for the year was, 'Living by the Holy Spirit, Galatians 5: 16 & 25'. The camp activities included talks, bible study, and counselling sessions centred on the theme, of helping the youth learn to live by the Holy Spirit.

Some students from the Okyeso RC Basic School, Shama Kedzi CRAN Methodist School, Pebi School Complex, Abakam Basic School, Sanka CRAN Basic School, and Ekon Basic School, were privileged to be sponsored by CRAN for the camp organised in Cape Coast. Out of the 155 participants for the camp, CRAN beneficiaries numbered 149. The students are always excited to participate in the camp.

Scripture Union (SU) CAMP 2022 - Volta



From December 19 to December 23, 2022, the S.U. Camp in Volta Region was held at the Dambai College of Education Demonstration Campus in the Krachie East region of the Oti Region. Over 150 students and roughly 7 skilled facilitators participated. Seven youngsters were funded by CRAN to attend the Christmas Camp. Three SHS pupils, three JHS students, and one elementary student were among them.

Among the lessons learned were how to have quiet time, select a career, efficiently study for examinations, and select mentors. Along with the above-listed key categories, kids also learned how to make friends, engage in physical activity, and maintain a healthy lifestyle.

The study materials offered to the participants, which included devotional books, "Daily Power," "Lies We Have Believed About Sex," and "Mr. Bee," were well appreciated by the participants. They were delighted to have the chance to see hitherto unexplored areas of the nation. Pastor Emmanuel Kwame Asior, the Volta Regional Coordinator, who is passionate about children's ministry and student welfare, accompanied the pupils.



Distribution of Stationery



In the second week of January 2023, most Basic, Junior High, and Senior High Schools (SHS) began their respective academic years. With the start of this academic year, pupils and students will advance to the next grade.

The Child Education Support Scheme (CESS) recipients got their stationery for the academic year. They each received a termly stipend, a notebook, a workbook, and writing supplies. The schoolteacher in charge of the beneficiaries receives the stipend, and the kids are required to collect it from the teacher daily. This is intended to motivate kids to attend class regularly and learn.

The CRAN officers used the opportunity of their routine visit to review the CESS beneficiaries' profiles and learn more about their school performance. The majority of students want to study more in order to get better scores. We urged them to continue working hard in school to enable them to attain their ambitions.
